

spends between six and eight hours a day working on the drawings and many take more than 350 hours to complete. He and his wife stay a mile away from the churchyard so Mr Thatcher can cycle to and from the site every day. Mr Thatcher teaches art

and art history to children aged 13 to 17 in a small school in Iowa. He has a bachelor of fine art from the University of Victoria and a masters in painting and drawing from the University of Saskatchewan. A series of drawings of the yew trees has been exhibited in the United States, Canada, England and France and his work hangs in corporate and private collec-
